physician shortage, and public health workforce needs—especially in rural and underserved areas. The curriculum integrates both **clinical and public health training**, equipping graduates to diagnose and treat common medical, surgical, pediatric, and obstetric conditions, as well as to lead health promotion, disease prevention, and emergency response programs. Courses include anatomy, pathology, internal medicine, surgery, maternal and child health, epidemiology, health education, and health service management. Graduates are qualified to work at the **Primary Health Care Unit (PHCU)** level, including health centers and district hospitals, and are capable of providing emergency interventions (e.g., caesarean section, appendectomy), coordinating health teams, and managing both curative and public health programs. This program was launched under the Health Sector Development Program (HSDP-III) to help achieve national public health goals and the MDGs. It is considered a cost-effective and efficient alternative to training large numbers of physicians while maintaining strong healthcare delivery capacity. The degree aligns with international standards of community and public health education, though the professional title of *Health Officer* is specific to Ethiopia.
